PROJECT Reports

• Wears Valley Ranch turning courses - Bob Law

The kids are back and turning boxes. There are 13 students with 3-4 new ones to be added in January. The shop has four 4 mini lathes, 3 for students (the usual number per class) and a Nova medium size lathe. Club members who teach in the program include Jake Niedling, Randy Fritchman, Ed Lewis, Tom Straddler, and Bob Law.

More about FANTASY OF TREES -- Don Adams

One of our chapter's charitable activities is the Fantasy of Trees (FOT), an annual fundraiser for Knoxville Children's Hospital. Each year we donate a few hundred ornaments of all types that the event organizers sell from a decorated tree at the auction. Last year's event was canceled due to COVID so the need is even greater this year. Plus, FOT is excited for woodturners to contribute other items for auction, such as small bowls, toys, platters, vases, goblets, etc.

Because FOT takes place during Thanksgiving weekend, the deadline is imminent. We will announce collection times and places soon. Please place securely-attached eyes and hangers on your ornaments, and wrap each individually in tissue paper. Also, if you submit more complex turnings, please suggest prices.

Items of all types, complexity, and skill are welcome. We need around 400 ornaments! Volunteers are also needed to help prepare the items for delivery. Please support this project so SMWTS can continue to be well represented in our community.



Comparing Tool High Speed Steel

To qualify as a high-speed steel, the chemical composition must meet certain minimum requirements, which are defined in the ASTM A600 Specification for High-Speed Tool Steels. Chart below presented in weight percent:


